Trash Disposal Guidelines

How we dispose our trash directly impacts how beautiful or 'not' beautiful our borough appears. Everyone has a part to play in keeping Sharon Hill looking great.

Trash that is not disposed of properly results in flyaway garbage that lands on the neighbor's grass, ends up in our sewers, and along the curbs. Additionally, the neighborhood has seen an increase in animals that love to get into uncovered trash. No thank you! Please follow these guidelines for putting your trash out and be a partner in keeping our streets clean and beautiful!

Securing Trash

Garbage must be in properly secured containers or tied plastic bags. To keep wind or animals from scattering trash, please secure garbage bags in sturdy containers before placing them at the curb. This courteous practice can help keep litter from spreading into yards and roads. In the case that trash escapes, residents are responsible for cleaning up the litter.

Helpful Tip

IF you are placing your trash at the curb in a TIED BAG not in a closed can and it contains food trash, spraying the bag with bleach (or a clean-up spray that contains bleach) can keep animals out of the bags.

Bulk Trash

Bulk trash is collected on Thursdays and Fridays. Any mattress, box spring, and /or any upholstered furniture **MUST** be sealed in a plastic bag or wrapped in plastic. The failure to do so will result in the trash not being collected and may result in a \$100 civil fine.

Recycling

Recycling is picked up every Wednesday except for weeks where a holiday falls on that Monday.

Do not place plastic bags in with your recycling. It jams the machine. Recycling bagged in plastic bags will not be collected. If you don't have a recycling can, a cardboard box will do the job.

Holiday Trash Collection Dates

Independence Day (Monday, July 4) – Trash will be picked up on Tuesday. Tuesday's trash will be picked up on Wednesday.

Labor Day (Monday, September 5) – Trash will be picked up on Tuesday. Tuesday's trash will be picked up on Wednesday.

Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, November 24) – Trash will be picked up the following Monday. Friday after Thanksgiving- regular Friday trash will be picked up.

Christmas Holiday Observed (Monday, December 26) – Trash will be picked up on Tuesday. Tuesday's trash will be picked up on Wednesday.

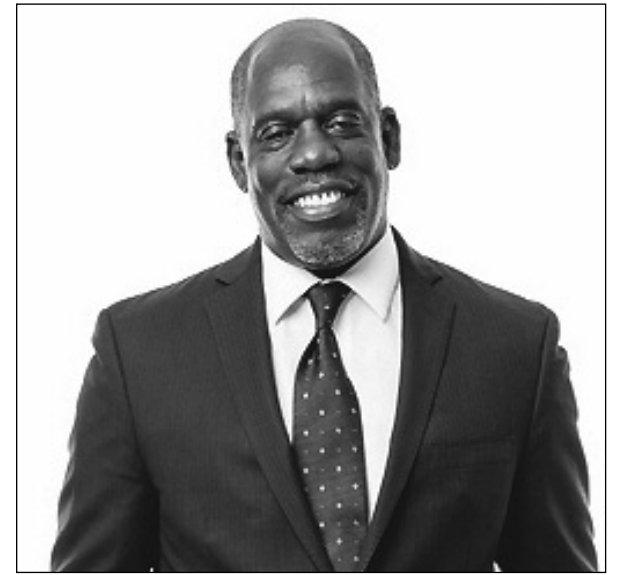

Tax Payment Tips

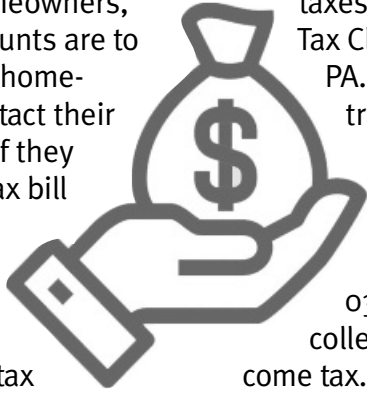

The 2022 Borough tax bills were mailed on February 7, 2022. If you have not received your bill contact the tax collector.

PA Law states that ALL homeowners, even those with escrow accounts are to receive their tax bill. It is the homeowner's responsibility to contact their mortgage company and ask if they are required to forward the tax bill or not. Most mortgage companies will request an electronic file from the tax collector (usually within 1-2 weeks of your receipt of the tax bills)

If you require a receipt of payment, you MUST send the tax collector a self-addressed STAMPED envelope, along with the entire tax bill. This is required whether you or your mortgage company makes the payment.

Payments are to be mailed to the bank! If you drop your payment at the Borough office, know that it is picked up daily, but



NOT sent to the bank until enough payments have been collected to send it in a FedEx package.

Delinquent taxes can be very confusing as two separate entities collect them. If you have unpaid Borough or School real estate taxes they are collected by the County Tax Claim at 201 W. Front St. Media, PA. If you have unpaid sewer and trash fees they are collected by MRRS at 610-565-1396.

All EIT (Earned Income Tax) questions should be directed to Keystone Collections at 724-978-0300, they serve the Borough in collection of delinquent earned income tax.

I am not responsible for County Real Estate Taxes, however I am aware that they were scheduled to be mailed in March.

Lastly, if you are a first-time homeowner or recently paid off your mortgage, and would like to learn more or understand more about property taxes, please send an email or call the tax collector at tonianne328@hotmail.com or 610-583-7616.

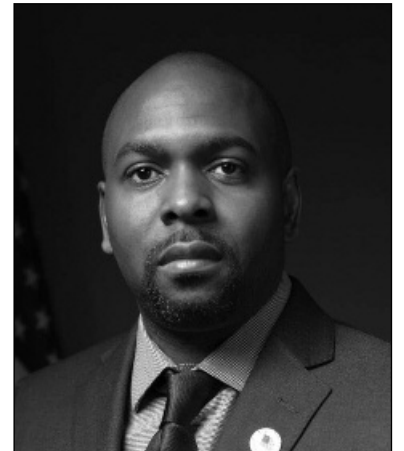

Five Delco Boroughs Collaborate on Chester Pike Revitalization Effort

Chester Pike has been a part of the landscape of this portion of Delaware County for over 300 years and has transformed during that time from a muddy and hazardous dirt path to a modern suburban corridor serving the needs of an emerging automobile culture. In more recent years the roadway has suffered the common complaints of many aging transportation networks including traffic congestion, deteriorated infrastructure, and disinvestment.

In response to the ongoing challenges facing Chester Pike, a number of the communities along its borders came together with the aim of working collaboratively towards a brighter future for the corridor. In early 2020, the Chester Pike Corridor Improvement Partners (CPCIP) was formed to address transportation, land use, and economic development issues along a central segment of Chester Pike. Run as a 501(c)3 nonprofit, the CPCIP is made up of representatives from the boroughs of Sharon Hill, Glenolden, Norwood, Prospect Park, and Ridley Park. As a group they seek to create better con-

nections between land use and transportation; improve the function, character, and appearance of the area; enhance economic development; and improve the overall quality of life.

With a strong emphasis on an intergovernmental approach, the collaborative has partnered with the Delaware County Planning Department for a multi-municipal Corridor Master Plan, which is due to be completed by the end of spring. The plan will inventory, map and analyze the physical condition, capacity, levels of service, safety and other transportation network metrics of the corridor, as well as identify and delineate needed improvement projects. Recommended funding sources and public engagement will also be components of the Master Plan.

This project will ultimately guide future growth and development along the Chester Pike passageway and has received letters of support from the region's legislators. Senator Anthony Williams, Senator Tim Kearney, Representative Regina Young and Representative David Dellosa all welcome improved safety and ac-

cessibility for walking and biking, as well as other transit networks that connect constituents to job centers, parks, schools, healthy food outlets, churches and more.

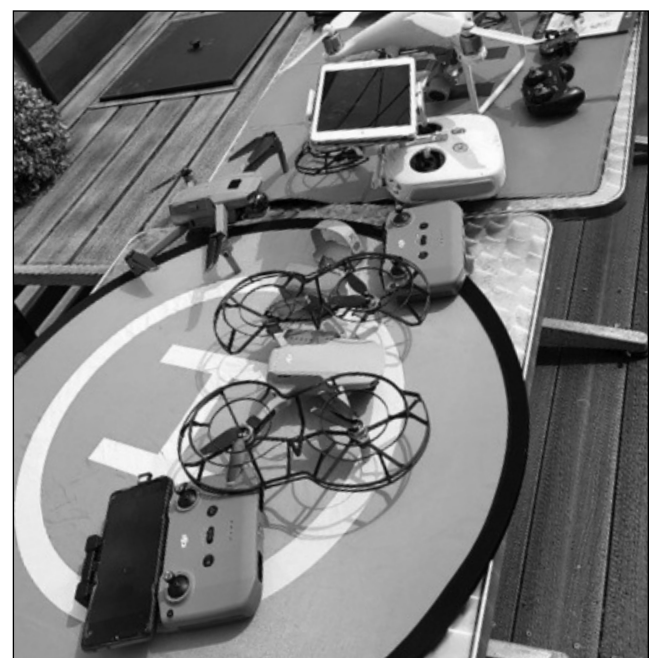
Sharon Hill Food Pantry

Drone Demonstrations at Sharon Hill Library

On March 26th, the Sharon Hill Public Library hosted a drone demonstration presented by Droneversity founder Ashlee Cooper. Ms. Cooper is an experienced STEM educator, molecular microbiology scientist, and Drone EXPERT. Her drone-industry credentials include certification as a Remote pilot with an sUAS rating, PA drone association board member, Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Safety Team representative, and the first Black female FAA DronePro in the U.S. North East region.

She has developed STEAM-aviation training for multiple organizations and Droneversity. Droneversity's students have a success pass rate of 100%. In addition, as an industry member of the FAA Unmanned Aircraft Systems Collegiate Training Initiative, Droneversity is committed to creating career pathways for economic development for those preparing for, changing, or looking to add a career. This was an awesome learning opportunity and great experience provided by the library.



Most Common Code Violations: What Every Sharon Hill Resident Should Know

The Borough of Sharon Hill is committed to working with the community to help preserve the quality and integrity of our neighborhood, while ensuring public health and safety. Our Code Enforcement Office has identified the top violations found within our community. In accordance with the Borough of Sharon Hill Codified Ordinances, if founded these violations may warrant fines and citations.

Construction without a Borough issued Permit

Permits must be applied for at Borough Hall and are issued by the borough.

High Weeds and Grass

Noxious Vegetation: *“Any neglected or uncared-for vegetation, whether living or dead, including all unpruned, decayed, rank or uncut weeds, grass, vines, plants, shrubs, brush or undergrowth, the height of which, either individually or collectively, exceeds a height of 10 inches.”*

[Amended 4-24-2008 by Ord. No. 1322]

Bulk Trash & Debris

Rubbish: *“Any waste, discarded or rejected matter or substance, vegetable, animal or mineral, including unused chattels, furnishings, tools, vehicles, implements, trash, debris, scrap, junk, garbage, leaves, decayed or fallen trees, the branches or other parts thereof, stones, ashes, cinders, papers and all other superfluous, abandoned or unused materials or substances of whatever kind and condition.”*

Miscellaneous Exterior Property Maintenance Violations

Regulation of Alterations and Repairs to Residential Buildings: *“In addition to the minimum standards contained within the Act, the Borough shall also enforce the International Residential Code 2015, as it applies to the Alteration and Repair of Residential Buildings, and property owners shall be required to obtain permits for all such alterations and repairs.”*

Failure to Remove Animal Waste

Deposit of wastes in unsanitary manner prohibited: *“It shall be unlawful for any person to place, deposit or permit to be deposited in any unsanitary manner on public or private property within the Borough of Sharon Hill or in any area under the jurisdiction of said Borough any human or animal excrement, garbage or other objectionable waste.”*

Loud Noise & Disturbances

Unnecessary noises prohibited: *“It shall be unlawful for any person to make or continue, or cause to be made or continued, any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others, or to create any unreasonably loud, disturbing and unnecessary noise of such character, intensity or duration as is detrimental to the life or health of any individual or persons within the limits of the Borough of Sharon Hill.”*

Illegal Dumping

Dumping regulations: *“No person shall dump any garbage, rubbish or refuse upon any street, highway or public right-of-way or upon any lot, property or premises in the Borough of Sharon Hill”*

Abandoned Vehicles

Abandonment prohibited: *“It shall be unlawful to park, store or leave any motor vehicle of any kind in a wrecked, junked, stripped or abandoned condition in a place where its presence constitutes a hazard on private property or for the owner of such motor vehicle or the owner or occupant of any property to allow, permit or suffer the same to be left upon any privately owned property unless the same is authorized in connection with a business property operated pursuant to the zoning laws and other laws of the Borough.”*

Vacant Nuisance Properties

It is the hope of the Borough to call for the abatement of these nuisance conditions to ensure the quality of life of Sharon Hill residents. Therefore, we encourage residents to report suspected violations within their neighborhood.
